- **Gaza:** For 7 October 2023–20 September 2026, UNRWA, citing Gaza's Ministry of Health as reported by the Health Cluster, reported 73,914 Palestinians killed and 174,952 injured; within that source's 10 October 2025 ceasefire-announcement period through 20 September, it reported 1,394 fatalities and 4,991 injuries. - **Ukraine:** OHCHR verified 368 civilians killed and 2,314 injured in Government-controlled territory in August 2026. It verified a minimum of four killed and 35 injured in Russian-occupied territory but said the actual toll was likely significantly higher; Russian-authority figures for the occupied territory and Russian Federation were not independently verified. - **Sudan:** The casualty figure is contested rather than a single confirmed total: a ReliefWeb-hosted analysis said ACLED had recorded nearly 30,000 reported deaths by late 2024, while independent investigations and international-media estimates suggested the true death toll may exceed 150,000. - **Myanmar:** OCHA's 13 July update said more than 16 million people required assistance and nearly 3.8 million were displaced; UN Myanmar's dashboard later recorded assistance reaching an estimated 3.1 million people by 30 June 2026. [OCHA](#) (UN/humanitarian) [UN Myanmar](#) (UN agency)
- **Lebanon:** Military activity remained active on 26 September, when WAFA reported explosions, artillery fire, airstrikes and an Israeli force remaining on Deir Mimas's southern outskirts; the report gave no casualty figure. [WAFA](#) (Palestinian official)

MIDDLE EAST

Gaza Strip

Casualties: Between 7 October 2023 and 20 September 2026, Gaza's Ministry of Health, as reported by the Health Cluster, recorded 73,914 Palestinians killed and 174,952 injured, according to UNRWA. UNRWA states that 1,394 of the fatalities and 4,991 of the injuries were recorded from the 10 October 2025 ceasefire announcement through 20 September 2026. [UNRWA](#) (UN agency)

Recent reporting and unsafe shelter: WAFA reported on 26 September that an Israeli drone strike near Julis Street, west of Nuseirat refugee camp, killed one Palestinian and injured several others. Separately, OCHA reported that a war-damaged six-storey residential building in Tal al Hawa, Gaza City, collapsed on 16 September, killing 21 people, including 12 children, and injuring dozens; it said rescue operations and repair of unsafe buildings were constrained by shortages of heavy machinery, fuel, engine oil, spare parts and other supplies. Health, aid and shelter: UNRWA reported that shortages of fuel, lubricant oil and spare parts temporarily disrupted several Gaza health centres, and that Israeli authorities had blocked UNRWA from directly bringing humanitarian personnel and aid into Gaza since March 2025. Its 14–28 June 2026 shelter assessment found that 1.98 million people, 94 per cent of Gaza's population, required shelter or non-food-item assistance, with 58 per cent facing critical or catastrophic shelter needs. West Bank

Casualties: Between 7 October 2023 and 15 September 2026, OCHA data cited by UNRWA recorded 1,136 Palestinians killed in the occupied West Bank, including East Jerusalem; at least 250 were children and 89 were killed from the start of 2026 to that date. The consulted sources do not state a cumulative West Bank injury total. For OCHA's 8–14 September reporting period, no Palestinian fatalities and at least 27 Palestinians injured by Israeli forces or settlers were documented. Settler violence, displacement and assistance: By 14 September, OCHA had recorded more than 1,600 settler attacks resulting in casualties, property damage or both across 275 Palestinian communities in 2026, and more than 4,300 Palestinians displaced in 2026 due to demolitions, evictions, settler attacks and related access restrictions. During 8–14 September, Israeli authorities demolished or forced the demolition of 46 Palestinian-owned structures, displacing 57 people. OCHA also reported that WFP reduced West Bank food-assistance recipients from 400,000 to 200,000 from September because of funding constraints. [OCHA](#) (UN/humanitarian)

Lebanon

Active military activity: On 26 September, WAFA reported Israeli explosions in Tiri, artillery fire on Shaqra, airstrikes on Jabal al-Rafi', and an Israeli force advancing to and remaining on the southern outskirts of Deir Mimas. WAFA stated no casualty or injury figure in this report. [WAFA](#) (Palestinian official)

EASTERN EUROPE

Russia–Ukraine Conflict

Verified civilian casualties: For August 2026, OHCHR verified 368 civilians killed and 2,314 injured in territory controlled by the Government of Ukraine. OHCHR's separate 16 September nationwide update recorded at least 372 civilians killed and 2,349 injured across Ukraine in August, including four killed and 35 injured in territory occupied by the Russian Federation; its 1 January–31 August 2026 total was 2,222 killed and 13,058 injured. Russian-occupied territory and Russian claims: OHCHR said restrictions on civic space reduced publicly available information in Russian-occupied Ukrainian territory and that the actual toll was likely significantly higher than its verified August minimum of four killed and 35 injured. Russian authorities' August allegations of at least 85 killed and 498 injured in occupied territory, and 113 killed and 736 injured in the Russian Federation, could not be verified by OHCHR because independent sources were unavailable. Russian government claim: RT reported on 26 September that Russian-appointed Kherson Region governor Vladimir Saldo claimed a Ukrainian drone strike in Askania-Nova killed two women and injured two people, while a separate claimed strike near Chaplinka killed a truck driver. This is a Russian government claim, not independently verified casualty data. [RT](#) (Russian state)

AFRICA

Sudan

Conflict and displacement: OCHA reported that fighting subsided notably in Khartoum and Aj Jazirah during 2025, enabling more than 2.2 million people to return to their areas of origin, while hostilities intensified dramatically across much of Darfur and Kordofan. OCHA reported 9.3 million internally displaced people as of 30 October, although the consulted webpage did not state the year beside that date, 4.4 million people who had fled to neighbouring countries, and more than 20 areas in or at risk of famine. Front-line developments: ACLED reported that the Sudan Founding Alliance launched heavy drone strikes on Al-Damazine on 13 and 14 September, targeting fuel stations, the airport and a hospital; it recorded 11 explosions across the city. ACLED also said the coalition seized six villages in Al Kurmuk locality on 11 September. In its 23 July update, ACLED recorded 63 fatalities across Tina, Karnoi and Um Baru localities in North Darfur since June 2026, and reported RSF attacks on roughly 10 Zaghawa villages and towns along the Chad border. Contested death estimates: A ReliefWeb-hosted 9 June analysis said ACLED had recorded nearly 30,000 reported deaths by late 2024, while independent investigations and international-media estimates suggested the true death toll may exceed 150,000. It

characterized these estimates as highly contested; they are not directly comparable confirmed totals. [ReliefWeb](#) (UN/humanitarian)

ASIA

Myanmar

Humanitarian needs and displacement: OCHA's 13 July 2026 update reported that more than 16 million people needed assistance amid conflict, displacement, protection risks and access constraints. It estimated nearly 3.8 million people were displaced across Myanmar, including more than 100,000 people displaced by recent hostilities in Magway. [OCHA](#) (UN/humanitarian)

Response and funding: UN Myanmar's HNRP 2026 Quarter 2 Dashboard reported that partners had reached an estimated 3.1 million affected people by 30 June 2026, 63 per cent of the annual target, including 1.3 million internally displaced people. It stated that 1.6 million people in the hyper-prioritized caseload had received assistance, 64 per cent of those targeted, and cautioned that reach shows breadth of assistance rather than whether every recipient received sufficient or sustained aid. Recent delivery: On 11 September, UN Myanmar reported a humanitarian flight delivering 46 tonnes of essential medical and nutrition supplies during the monsoon season. It stated that an estimated 8.4 million women and girls needed life-saving sexual and reproductive-health and protection services. [UN Myanmar](#) (UN agency)
